## Standards

Concepts taught in the choral classes will be based on the NC Essential Standards for Music Education, implemented in 2012 by The North Carolina Department of Public Instruction. Additionally, the National Association for Music Education has a list of standards to provide a well-rounded music experience for all students. I follow these guidelines in choosing music, creating unit and lesson planning, and in my thoughts of what each ensemble should do each day. To meet these state and national standards, all of the ensembles will be studying and singing Choral music from a wide variety of time periods and genres. We will also study vocal health, music literacy, music theory, and music history/ contextual relevancy.

## Programs Offered Gospel Choir

The purpose of this course is to develop, expose, and expand musical talents through a variety of gospel music (i.e. spirituals, anthems, contemporary and traditional gospel as well as all music from different cultures).

Students will learn intervals, rhythms, ear training, and sight-singing skills allowing them to be more vocally independent.

## Choral Ensemble

(Vocal Music Beginning)
This Choir offers a variety of learning experiences for new choral musicians. This ensemble offers exposure to a variety of musical styles while learning the beginnings of music history, music literacy, vocal technique, and performing in a group. Students will be introduced to systems like solfege and the "Takadimi" rhythm system that assist in learning the basics of sight-reading.

## Treble Choir

## (Vocal Music Intermediate)

As the step following the Choral Ensemble, this choir continues to refine the skill sets initially introduced. This class offers expansion and refinement in music literacy, sight-reading, and in addition, challenges students by exposing them to musical notation/dictation. This level of music performance is for intermediate and early proficient musicians. This ensemble oftentimes participates in MPA, (Music Performance Adjudication) in the spring. The ensemble is assessed on its performance and sight reading skills, and graded by a panel of adjudicators. Students can audition for this ensemble or be recommended by the Director.

## Varsity Singers (Honors)

(Vocal Music Proficient)

This class is available to students by audition or by the director's recommendation based upon previous performances. Students are expected to sight-read proficiently, to be equipped with music literacy and notation knowledge, and to express sincere interest in dedicating time and effort to choral performance. If a student has not taken Mixed Ensemble or Women's Chorus previously, and believes he/she should be enrolled in the advanced ensemble, an audition will be required. This ensemble represents Person High School annually at MPA, (Music Performance Adjudication). The ensemble is assessed on its performance and sight-reading skills at a proficient/advanced level, and then graded by a panel of adjudicators. The ensemble receives commentary on the performance for constructive critique and student reflection.

## Daily Procedures

1. Enter the classroom quietly and on time.
2. Gather daily materials and take your seat.
3. Read the board for the agenda/instructions.
4. Wait for Ms. Booth to dismiss at the end of class.

## Choral Standards and Expectations

## Conduct

Each student will represent the Choir, the Music Department, and Person High School in an exemplary fashion. In addition to the expectations of conduct stated in the Person County Schools Handbook, choir students are expected to display proper conduct and respect of the highest caliber during rehearsals, performances, festivals, contests, field trips, and any other activities associated with chorus and outside it. Respect toward peers and adults is absolutely mandatory; anything less is unacceptable behavior, and can have an affect on future ensemble placement and participation, as well as the enforcement of necessary consequences and disciplinary action. There is zero tolerance for apathy and distracting other students from learning.

Bathroom Policy: Students should be sure to use the restroom before class! Each week, students will be allotted one-bathroom pass. Students will not be allowed to go during first ten or last ten minutes of class. If a student has to go more than the number of times allotted, class time missed can be made up in an after school rehearsal. Please indicate on the student information sheet if your child needs other bathroom accommodations.

Educational Disruption Procedures:
$1^{\text {st }}$ Offense- Verbal Warning
$2^{\text {nd }}$ Offense- After class conference between teacher and student.
$3^{\text {rd }}$ Offense- Parental Contact/Conference.
$4^{\text {th }}$ Offense- Administrative Referral

## Expectations

I ask that my students abide by "The Professional Ps:"

1. Polite - Being polite means showing respect for those around you, including yourself. Respectful and polite words, tone, actions and attitude should be given to your classmates, teachers, interns, student teachers, substitutes, and yourself.
You may not always like someone else's singing - you are entitled to your own opinion, but you are not at liberty to always share it. We will never laugh or make fun of those around us because everyone will always be doing his or her best.
2. Punctual - Students should be punctual. This applies to class and performances. A call time will be announced for all formal and required performances.
3. Prepared - Items needed for class each day are outlined in the supplies and materials section. Please note that the following items are not on the supply list and therefore have no place in our classroom: electronic devices (unless instructed otherwise,) gum, work for other classes, food, drinks other than water, etc. Anything that distracts from rehearsals will not be tolerated. After a warning, any distracting items will be confiscated and kept in the front office.
4. Positive - Students should have a positive attitude in class. It is expected that everyone arrives ready to sing. Your attitude can determine whether you enjoy our time together or not! Set yourself up for success from the start!
5. Participate - All students should come to class with a willingness to participate in each activity. Each person's participation is necessary for the success of the ensemble!

## Accommodations

Students with documentation of special accommodations or any disability should arrange to see the music director as soon as possible. Music is for everyone! It is important that you feel comfortable and supported while on this exciting, educational journey! If you are unsure or have any questions regarding this matter, you can contact me directly, or feel free to contact the student's assigned counselor.

## Attendance/Absences

Students are required to attend all rehearsals and concerts. Religious holidays, illness (with a doctor's note,) compromised state of affairs of immediate family, and some pre-approved situations are excusable absences. Absences must be reported beforehand (or promptly, in the event of emergency,) and not after the occurrence. Students are responsible for making up any material or assignments missed due to absences. When there are direct conflicts with other school activities, a note must be submitted to Ms. Booth prior to the event. Concert dates are presented at the beginning of the semester, accessible on Powerschool Learning, and are listed in the Choral Handbook. These performances are mandatory. An alternate assignment is available for students who are ill and cannot perform in the concert. All other excuses will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis. For every 3 tardies acquired by a student, he/she must serve time in detention. This can be completed after school by scheduling a time with Ms. Booth. Accumulation of additional tardies may result in a parent/ teacher conference or administrative action. Tardies can be excused with a parent's note if there are extenuating circumstances; however, students are held responsible to manage their time wisely during the class-change break.

## Fundraising

Each year, the choral department sponsors student fundraisers to support our program and to involve the local community. Rather than students paying regular "Fair Share Fees" or Dues to participate in choir, I believe in bringing the community together to support music in our schools, and in turn, we aspire to give back to the community as well.
Students will perform fundraisers to raise money for field trips, to pay for uniforms, to buy music and materials, and to compete in competitions/festivals at a lower cost. With funding comes opportunities to travel and share music beyond the local community! We have many performances on the books for the semester; raising money will make trips more accessible for ensembles to attend. More information will be communicated after the confirmation of dates and details.

## Resources

Classroom Dojo: This FREE app will be used during class to assist in tracking absences, tardies, and will award/deduct points from students' weekly performance grades based on the "Professional P's," rehearsal/performance expectations, and procedures outlined in Choral Handbook. Parents and students can access this application by using the code issued at the beginning of the semester. It can be accessed by downloading Classroom Dojo or accessing through the website itself.

Remind: The (free) Remind app is a forum where students and their teacher can partake in a group conversation to post questions, reminders, and announcements. This app is particularly convenient because they send messages directly to a student's phone. Parents and Students can download the app or just receive the announcements as text messages.

Google Drive: Practice Tracks and helpful documents are provided to students via Google Drive for convenience and clarity.

Chorus Weebly Website: Our Chorus Website will have announcements, dates, practice materials, assignments, and additional resources available for parents and students. This handbook will also be posted in the "Documents and Resources" page.

## Varsity Singers/Treble Choir

(Vocal Music Intermediate and Intermediate/Proficient)
Women- Women must wear their Person High School Chorus attire purchased at the beginning of the semester. An order will be placed in the beginning of the school year for students in need of a dress.
Concert Attire:

- Black Dress (\$65)
- Black, closed-toe shoes (preferably flats; heels are acceptable, but no more than $1 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{in}$.)
- Black panty hose or tights (REQUIRED)
- Black Head Band/ or hair pulled away from the face
- Pearls (Property of PHS Chorus, provided before the concert)

Men- Men must wear their Person High School Chorus Tuxedo purchased at the beginning of the semester. An order will be placed at the beginning of the semester to accommodate gentleman needing to acquire these items. Concert Attire:

- White, Button-Down Shirt
- Black Dress Slacks
- Black Jacket, Cummerbund
- Black Bow-Tie, Coat Pins

- Men are responsible for purchasing separately: Black Socks and Black Dress Shoes
* These uniforms are required to be clean and wrinkle free for each performance! They will be worn for every performance unless otherwise stated. If students are not wearing Performance Dress, then they will be instructed to wear their PHS Chorus T-Shirts, Jeans, and closed-toe shoes for informal performances. These T-Shirts are $\$ 10$ for purchase. Please do not wait until concert week to realize you do not have these items! Please leave shiny, distracting accessories at home. ©
